NEPTUN REGISTRATION

- Course and exam registration
- You will have to sign up for your exams at the end of the course
- Check your grades after the exams

For educational administration, the NEPTUN Education System is applied at all faculties of the University of Debrecen. This electronic system is used to manage all administrative matters related to registration, courses, exams, tuition fees and stipends. The system is used by all students as well as administrators and lecturers throughout the University. For the students of the University of Debrecen the system offers the following possibilities:

- modify their personal data;
- access information about courses, study requirements, exam dates and locations;
- sign up for their courses;
- sign up for their exams;
- check their grades;
- accept the grade offered by the teacher;
- send and receive messages to and from lecturers and administrators;
- pay their tuition and other fees;
- send feedback about lecture(r)s.

Requesting network ID and setting password

Similarly to numerous electronic services of the University of Debrecen, you will need a network ID to use Neptun.

1. In case you already have a network ID and a password then you can login to Neptun with them.
2. In case you do not have a network ID then go to <https://directory.unideb.hu>, click on the link “hálózati azonosító létrehozása” in the middle of the page.
3. You can switch the website’s language to English by clicking on the “In English” link. Then you can request your network ID on the screen that appears after clicking on “registration page”.

Neptun identifier: you should have received it on the registration form. Your password is your date of birth in the following form: yymmdd. For example: if your date of birth is: December 14, 1989, your password will be: 891214.

Login to Neptun

1. The Neptun system can be reached in this web page: <http://neptun.unideb.hu>
2. Here click on the „For students” menu item, then on the „Hallgatói - Student” link
3. Write your network ID to the „Azonosító” field and the relevant password to the „Jelszó” field
4. To set the language to English select „English” in the „Nyelv” drop-down menu
5. Login to the system by clicking on „Bejelentkezés”

You have to make sure your status is active. For that follow the instructions:

1. On the top, click on the “Administration” menu and collect the “Enrollment/registration” field
2. Choose the current term and click on the “Register” field
3. After these steps your status have to be “accepted-active”

Subject and course registration

In Neptun you can register for subjects and courses. With the next steps you can do it successfully:

You are able to register for your subjects at the ‘Subjects’ menu then ‘Subjects registration’. You will have

to choose the current semester and click on ‘Show list’. You are able to register for the subject if you go to the ‘Option’ and click on ‘Register’.

Registering for exams

Under the ‘Exam’ menu if you press ‘Exam registration’ you will be able to register for your final exams. You have to choose the current semester and press on the ‘List exams’ to see the exam list. At the end of the line if you press ‘Option’ you can register for the exam.

If you want to deregister from your registered exam date, you have to choose ‘Exam’ menu, then ‘Selected exams’ menu. You will see those exams you are registered for. At the end of the line if you press ‘Option’ you can deregister from the exam. You are able to deregister from the exam until 12.00am the day before the exam.

Regarding the use of Neptun, further help is available by using the context-sensitive help in the information box on the left side of the screen; or by clicking the question mark icon in the top right corner you can download the complete user’s manual of Neptun Student Web in pdf format.

HOW TO PAY THE ACCOMMODATION FEE IN THE UNIVERSITY STUDENT HOSTELS?

Student accommodation fees are due at the beginning of the semester. Please make the payment in a timely way. If you have any problems or questions concerning the settling of the invoice, seek assistance at the student hostel office.

Paying the accommodation fee consists of two steps: first you need to pay the amount to the students' collective account, and then you need to settle the invoice in the Neptun system.

1. Transferring money to the collective account

We ask students to go to a bank and pay the amount of the accommodation fee in cash, or log in to their online bank account and transfer the amount to the students' collective account.

When transferring money to the collective account, the six-number NEPTUN code in "NK-Neptun-code" format must be entered into the information space along with the name of the student (e.g.: NK-AB1234 Lastname Firstname). Account information for the collective account is as follows:

Please note that processing money deposits or money transfers may take 2-3 working days. Consider this before financial transactions so as not to miss any deadlines.

2. Making payment through the Neptun system

Log in to your Neptun account. Imposed items can be found in the "Payments" menu under the "Finances" menu item (see picture). To settle any unpaid (i.e. active) items mark the check box next to the item(s) due, then click the "Pay in" button. Neptun will provide a last reminder about the possibility of assigning a payer, as this setting cannot be modified once the item(s) have been paid. If all data is correctly set, click "OK". Then click the "Pay in" button again. The system will confirm the payment in another pop-up window.

Emergency care

MEDICAL PRECONDITIONS

Requested medical examination

Students coming to the Faculty of Medicine, Dentistry, Pharmacy, medical laboratory analytics, physiotherapist and public health should bring medical certificates in English language such as follows:

- Chest X-ray examinations or pulmonary report (max. one year old)
- Immunisation, vaccination

history, The date and result of HBsAT antibody measurement (Hepatitis-B, HCV, HIV, TBC, Tetanus, Mumps, Rubella, Pertussis, Polio)

For practices at the Pediatrics and Obstetrics Department additional items **besides the ones mentioned above:**

- Stool culture (max. one-month old)

• Lues serology (max. one-year old)
The certificate issued in English should contain the following data:

- Surname
- First name
- Date of birth

I certify that the information included about the above student is correct. In my opinion, this individual has no health problems that have impact

on his/her fitness to work/practice in hospital.

If you cannot bring these certificates in English language, they can be prepared also after arrival, however, please be aware that you will have to pay for it.

**STUDENT CARD**

Registered students can apply for a student card, which entitles them to a discount price at public transport, some restaurants, stores and cinemas. Erasmus students can apply only for a temporary student card at the **Student Service Center**. The temporary card is valid only for 2 months, when it expires you have to renew it at the Student Service Center.



All international students have to register at the Office of Immigration and Nationality.

In case you need a visa to come to Hungary, you will need to apply for the residence permit within 30 days. It will replace your visa. You will be able to travel back to your home country and travel within the Schengen area with a valid residence permit.

The following checklist includes all the necessary documents that you must obtain before you go to the Office of Immigration and Nationality in Debrecen.

Please make sure that you have all of them:

1. Students who cannot enter Hungary without a visa

- Passport
- Passport size photo (stamped on the backside by the Hungarian Consulate)

Documentation of your residential background:

- Address registration form signed by owner
- “Adatlap a tartózkodási engedély kiadásához” (please do not stick your photo on)

2. Non-EEA citizen students who can enter Hungary without a visa

- Passport
- Passport size photo
- 18,000 HUF in fee stamps (“illetékbélyeg” – available at any post office)
- Certificate of your student status
- Valid student ID card
- Health insurance for the whole stay in Hungary

Documentation of your residential background:

- Certificate of accommodation in the student hostel
- Lease contract or any other agreement about your accommodation (containing the expiration date and the amount of rental fee)
- Contract or statement providing accommodation by courtesy

Documentation of your financial background:

- A written declaration explaining your financial circumstances: the source, amount, currency and regularity of your income
- If you have a Hungarian bank account: history of debits and credits on this account at least for the previous 6 months
- If you have access to a foreign bank account: history of debits and credits on this account at least for the previous 6 months
- If you receive cash via money transfer: all currency exchange statements and spot cash statements within a 6 month time period
- It is worth collecting all money-related documents to avoid complications (bank account

certificate, transfer history, money exchange receipts, payout/ATM receipts)

Proof of ability to leave Hungary:

- Valid ticket or reservation
- Amount of money to buy a ticket put in deposit in your bank account

Forms to be filled in:

- “Accommodation reporting form for third country nationals” (with the signature of the person or the dormitory providing your accommodation)
- “Application for residence permit for the purpose of studies”, do not stick on your photo

3. Students from EEA countries (members of the EU and Lichtenstein, Norway, Iceland and Switzerland)

- Passport or ID card
- 1000 HUF in fee stamps (“illetékbélyeg” – available at any post office)
- Health insurance card
- Certificate of your student status (you get this after registration at the University)

Documentation of your residential background:

- Certificate of accommodation in a student hostel

- The ownership certificate
- Lease contract or any other agreement about your accommodation (containing the expiration date and the amount of rental fee)
- Contract or statement providing accommodation by courtesy

Documentation of your financial background:

- scholarship/student loan certificate
- your own bank account certificate / transfer history
- money exchange receipts / payout (ATM) receipts
- cash via money transfer (e.g.: Western Union) certificates

Form to be filled in:

- “Form for issuing registration certificate and reporting accommodation”

Please provide a copy of your residence permit to the International Office.

If your residence permit is about to expire you have to apply for a renewal at the Office of Immigration.

Please keep in mind that your current residence permit can be extended by 6 months before its expiry date but you are required



to come for an extension at least 30 days before the expiry date.

These are the basic documents to bring to extend your residence permit:

1. the Application Form – printable from the website (www.bmbah.hu) or available at the Office of Immigration. For a quicker

process, please fill it in before you go there.

2. 1 ID Photo (the size as in passports)
3. 10.000 HUF in Fee Stamps (available at any Post Office)
4. Current Residence Permit and
5. Passport valid for the requested period

Erasmus Student Network Debrecen (ESN Debrecen) is a voluntary student organization working for international and exchange students coming to study at the University of Debrecen. ESN Debrecen is a member of the Student Union of the UD, therefore it is an official student body representing incoming exchange students' rights while also aiming to promote mobility among all university students. ESN Debrecen works closely with the International Office of the University of Debrecen to make the incoming students life easier.

Members of ESN Debrecen are students themselves, organizing social, cultural or sport events and trips to students in their free time.

ESN Debrecen coordinates the Erasmus Buddy Programme which helps incoming students in their integration to university life by pairing them with local students. The Erasmus Buddy Programme helps incoming students to accommodate themselves with the help of their Buddies, get to know local life at Debrecen – where to do shopping, where to arrange official university and/or city bureaucratic matters, introducing international students to student friendly restaurants and bars and many other aspects of student life. It is especially useful in the first few weeks, however, ESN Debrecen hopes that the programme helps building friendships lasting longer than a semester.





ESN Debrecen offers a wide variety of programmes available for all students. Orientation days, welcome and farewell dinners, sight-seeing, visiting the local spa, trips and excursions to Budapest and Hungarian wine regions. The goal is to bring the Hungarian culture close to the international students, therefore ESN organizes many events to show how diverse our culture is – nights when students have a chance to learn Hungarian folk dance, Hungarian cooking class during which we make a Hungarian dish together step by step or Hungarian Movie Club to watch Hungarian movies with English subtitles. International Dinner – one

of the most popular ESN event – is a night when all students have a chance to show how tasty their national cuisine is, bringing home-cooked typical national dishes for other students to taste them.

A highlight of the semester is when ESN organizes charity events during the International Social Erasmus Week, a project of ESN International. Giving back to the local community, doing charity, promoting volunteering, creating something that has an impact on the local life, like painting the paediatric hospital, planting trees, making food for homeless people, donating blood. ESN organizes these and many other weekly events for students to keep them entertained, to provide a platform for students to meet local and international students, to bring them together, to make them a community.

UNIPASS CARD

Students and employees of the University of Debrecen may request a UniPass card, which is used for identification on the university campuses and provides access to certain services. Outside of the university campus the card entitles the cardholder to discounts at selected service providers. You can order your card anytime during the academic year. with your EduID and password (the same ID and password you use for the Neptun system), fill in the order form and upload your photo.

All university students can register FREE to the University and National Library, University of Debrecen (in Hungarian DEENK). Services of DEENK libraries are available only with UniPass Card. Only UniPass Card can be used as a reading card. More information are on the Library website: <http://www.lib.unideb.hu/en/registration>

Students may register in any one of the library units: the card given to you upon registration is valid in all the

other library units of the university (Agricultural Science Library, Kenézy Life Sciences Library, Library of The Conservatory, Engineering Library, Arts and Sciences Library, Library of the Faculty of Education, Social Sciences Library).





Budapest Liszt Ferenc International Airport (BUD) is located on the edge of the capital, with two terminals for passenger traffic: 2A and 2B.

You can get to Debrecen by train, which departs from the nearby Kobánya-Kispest railway station.

From the airport, take bus no. 200E to get to the railway station (which is the last stop of the bus). You can buy the bus ticket at the bus stop from the ticket machine if you have a debit card or Hungarian Forints. The bus will take you to Kobánya-Kispest Railway Station in about 20-25 minutes, where you can buy a train ticket and board a train to Debrecen (or board the subway to get to Budapest centre).

It is recommended that you take an Intercity (IC) train, which is faster than regular trains and as it is a direct train, you do not have to

change. For an IC train you need to buy a ticket and a seat-reservation to Debrecen. The distance between Kobánya-Kispest and Debrecen is 210 km and it takes 2 hours and 35 minutes to reach Debrecen by an IC train.

Trains from Kobánya-Kispest Railway Station to Debrecen depart every hour.

It is also possible to take an **airport shuttle** from the airport of Budapest to Debrecen, but it requires your advance booking with a transfer company.
