Entry Requirements

The current course finder is displaying courses offered in the academic year 2018/19. Changes may be made for the 2019/20 academic year, with the updated course finder being published in summer 2019. Students must meet all required prerequisites as stated in the course finder.

Applicants should use the current course finder as a guide when selecting courses.

Restricted courses

Architecture, Art and Design studio based courses are only available to applicants nominated on an Art & Design subject specific exchange.

Medicine and Veterinary Medicine courses are not available.

*Please note that Informatics and Psychology have been added to this high pressure list. While entry will be more competitive, we will do our best to place students in their preferred courses.

Course load

Students must enrol in 60 credits per semester. (Typically, three 20-credit courses)

Exceptions:

Students who are required to take a particular course the only option being of 10 credits. This results in the student choosing an underload (minimum 50 credits) or an overload (maximum 70 credits).

Students who are completing a dissertation or other formal work for their home institution: this requires written confirmation of this study from their home university.



There are no further exceptions that would result in an underload or overload of credits.

Compulsory Attendance

All visiting students must attend and engage fully in the classes that they are enrolled in at the University of Edinburgh. If students consistently fail to attend or engage with their studies the issue will be escalated within their College and may result in the ultimate exclusion of the student.

Students will be encouraged to speak with their Personal Tutor or the Student Support team in their school if they are experiencing difficulties (i.e. academic, personal, health). This will enable them to support the student in improving their attendance, their wider engagement with their studies, and importantly to address any issues that may be of concern to them.

Transcripts

Students will provide a transcript address when completing their application to the University of Edinburgh. At the end of their studies, their final transcript will be posted to the address indicated. Please advise your students of the correct address.

Re-sits and Overseas Examination Service

During the University of Edinburgh's re-sit diet, many Exchange students will be given the opportunity to re-sit courses which they have failed earlier in the academic year.

Please note that not all students will be eligible to re-sit and those which are eligible to-re-sit are not guaranteed an overseas re-sit.

Accommodation

Full year Erasmus students are guaranteed an offer of University Accommodation provided they submit an accommodation application by the deadline.

Due to the demand on our accommodation, single semester Erasmus students are not guaranteed an offer of accommodation. These students are still encouraged to apply for accommodation and go on to our waiting list; if any accommodation does become available, the Accommodation will contact the student to make them aware.

Students must have accepted an unconditional offer to study at the University of Edinburgh before they can apply for accommodation.

Students will list their top 5 accommodation preferences as part of the application. While we can guarantee an offer, we unfortunately cannot guarantee that students are placed in their preferred accommodation, although the Allocations staff will endeavour to do so when possible.



Offers will expire if not accepted within 7 days. It is therefore important that students regularly check their University of Edinburgh email account (and check their spam folders).
