You can choose between two different courses that include language classes to suit your level of proficiency. You will gain valuable insights into German and Bavarian cultural traditions, literature and history, and also have the chance to visit iconic landmarks. We organize excursions to destinations such as the medieval town of Rothenburg ob der Tauber and the UNESCO World Heritage site Regensburg.

We also offer a varied range of workshops for you to choose from, depending on your interests.

The KU International Summer School will be an unforgettable experience for you.

Additionally, university students can earn credit points according to the regulations of their home university.

Course 1 | Intensive German and Cultural Studies

(100 hrs, excursions and workshops included)

Intensive German language course

Language requirements: basic to advanced level, according to your individual level of proficiency. A minimum level of A1/elementary is required.

Speaking and listening skills will be practiced intensively, but reading and writing skills will not be neglected. An important component of the cultural education will be project work, in which the participants will go in small groups and meet up with their interview partners, in order to carry out research on a specific topic.

Conversation and cultural studies I (option I)

Language requirements: basic to intermediate level. A minimum level of A1/elementary is required.

In this course, participants will have a number of opportunities to practice speaking. Everyday communication (e.g. shopping, ordering food, finding one's way, travelling) will be practiced through role plays, short interviews, short presentations, dialogs, and simple discussions. In addition, participants will learn how to convey their communicative needs (e.g. preferences, assumptions and opinions, cultural differences). Based on these topics, relevant vocabulary and idioms will be taught. Special emphasis will be placed on speaking in authentic situations.

Conversation and cultural studies II (option II)

Language requirements: upper intermediate to advanced level.

In this course, participants will focus on getting to know the German culture. The goal of this course is to help students improve their vocabulary and gain confidence while speaking and while discussing interesting (inter-)cultural topics. Participants will be able to help choose the topics discussed during this course. This course allows students to expand their personal communication skills by giving short presentations and working in small groups.

Target group

Students who have an interest in the German language and experience with the German culture.

Course 2 | Intensive German and German Literature

(100 hrs, excursions and workshops included)

Intensive German language course

Language requirements: upper intermediate to advanced level.

Speaking and listening skills will be practiced intensively, but reading and writing skills will not be neglected. An important component of the cultural education will be project work, in which the participants will go in small groups and meet up with their interview partners, in order to carry out research on a specific topic.

Literature course: Strong Women: A Journey of Discovery through Literature by and about Women

Language requirements: upper intermediate to advanced level.

"The Eternal Feminine beckons us on," we read in Part Two of Johann Wolfgang von Goethe's renowned drama Faust. Yet, how is womanhood approached in literature, by women writers and in texts about and by women?

This course investigates female characterization in myth and fairy tale, female characters in literature, and gives an insight into the careers and works of selected women poets.

Readings in the course will include texts by Johann Wolfgang von Goethe, Jacob and Wilhelm Grimm, Annette von Droste-Hülshoff, Theodor Fontane, Franziska Gräfin zu Reventlow, Else Lasker-Schüler and Christa Wolf.

Target group

Students with both interest in and experience with German language and literature.
