Nomination and Application Process	Send a confirmation e-mail to Mrs. Linda Cristina Sousa (incoming@puc-rio.br) Students` required documents: Nomination letter; Online application form; Official transcript; Passport copy; Personal statement, International health insurance; Mandatory COVID 19 immunization- certificate; Payment of the administrative fee; 1 photo (3x4cm size). The online application form must be filled out for all types of registration, i.e., Intensive Program, Semester Exchange and Housing.

Language Requirements	Although students are not required a specific level of proficiency in Portuguese language, on the first day of classes all exchange students must take an oral placement test in order to confirm his/her knowledge of Portuguese. It is MANDATORY for all students not fully proficient in Portuguese to take a Portuguese as a Second Language course during the regular academic term according to his/her level. Students have the opportunity to take the Intensive Portuguese as a Second Language course before the regular semester begins, although this course is not mandatory.

Courses in English	Courses offered in English are subject to academic planning and are NOT necessarily offered every semester. For an updated list, please, check: http://www.puc-rio.br/ensinopesq/ccci/incoming/study english puc.html Courses taught in English have an undergraduate content based on different areas, such as: Culture, Literature, Business, Design, Civilization, History, Engineering, among others. No English level is required to attend the courses taught in English. Although an intermediate level (B1) or upper proficiency is strongly recommended.
Grading System	Grades range from minimum 0 (zero) to maximum 10 (ten) . 5 (five) is the minimum passing grade for undergraduate students and 6 (six) for graduate students.
Credits System (15 weeks academic semester)	1 credit = 1 class hour/week of lecture class 1 credit = 2 hours of laboratory class/week 1 credit = 3 hours of exercise class/week
Student's Workload per Semester (credits)	Exchange students must enroll for a minimum of 2 courses or 8 credits and for a maximum of 5 courses or 24 credits, including the MANDATORY Portuguese as a second language course (for those who are not fully proficient in Portuguese).

Pre-Term Portuguese as a Second Language Intensive Course Brazilian Seminars	Offered twice a year, before the regular academic semester, this 90h intensive course offers the international student the opportunity to learn, develop and experience the Brazilian language and culture before the beginning of the semester so as to be better skilled to attend regular classes. Four different levels are offered, from very basic to advanced level. Each student takes a written placement test on-line, and an oral one on the first day of classes. Tuition payment required. It is a 60h interdisciplinary program of lectures about contemporary Brazilian issues that are in the global scenario. Cultural activities and technical/company visits complements the experience.
