The maximum study load per semester is 30 ECTS.

For each ECTS, you should count with 25 to 30 working hours.

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ADMISSION PROCESS

If you are studying at one of our partner universities, please have your Study Abroad Office or Erasmus coordinator nominate you for our program.

French B1 level is required - according to the *Common European Framework of Reference for Languages* - to study at our faculties, **nevertheless a B2 level is highly recommended** at a Bachelor Level.

A B2 level English certificate is required for the courses that are taught entirely in English. A C1 Level is required at the Master and PhD Levels.

The Partner University is required to test and validate the level of its students' spoken and written French prior to sending their applications, and to acknowledge that it is sufficient for them to successfully pursue their studies during their stay.

FRENCH AS A FOREIGN LANGUAGE COURSES FOR EXCHANGE STUDENTS

The University's French language school, the "Institut de Langue et Culture Françaises" (ILCF) – Institute of French Language and Culture – offers **French as Foreign Language classes (FLE) free of charge for exchange students** during the semester: 21 hours, delivering **4 ECTS**.

ILCF organizes monthly intensive courses in June, July, August, September, and January. These courses can lead to several

ECTS credits but are not included in the exchange agreement and are on a fee-paying basis.

ACCOMMODATION

Finding an accommodation in Paris can be difficult.

Luckily ICP has signed an agreement with the public body CROUS administering University Residences around the Paris Region.

SEMESTER PERIODS

Semester 1 (Fall 2022)	Semester 2 (Spring 2023)
The semester runs from mid-September to mid-December 2022. Students studying at ICP should plan to be on campus for the Semester 1 exam period in December and January.	The semester runs from late January until end of May 2023 with two weeks off for Easter break. All Semester 2 and full year students should plan to be on campus for the exam period in April and May.
	The re-sit exam period is in June.

REGISTRATION AND ASSESSMENT

Students attend pre-selected courses for two weeks which they can drop or change afterwards.

After this two-week orientation period, students must register in courses that they will take for the rest of the semester.

To validate the courses, students must complete the course work which includes:

- Full attendance (2 absences allowed)
- Complete all midterm papers or any other form of evaluation required by the professor
- Sit for the final exam

GRADING SCALE

France has a different grading scale than other countries. Please find below important information:

TRANSCRIPT OF RECORDS

Certified transcripts of records will be **sent** to the student's home university **within two months** following the final exam.

Transcript will be sent at the end of the academic year for students staying for two semesters.

PLAN YOUR BUDGET

It takes an average monthly budget of about **1 300 € to live properly in Paris**.

To allow you to compare the cost of living in Paris with that of your home city, here are a few examples of prices to give you an indication:

Civil liability insurance (compulsory insurance)	€25-30/year
Social Security (health insurance)	Being a student in France entitles you to refund on most (around 70%) of your health expenses. For more information: <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=qEpy9Xr9UKk</u>
Complementary health insurance (optional)	around €50/month
Rent	€500-800/month
Renters insurance (compulsory insurance)	€30-70/year
Electricity, gas, water	€30/month
Public transportation subscription	 Monthly transportation card "Navigo" (Paris region): 75,20 € / month. You may travel on every Metro line, all RER (Regional Express Network) and Transilien train lines, all bus lines (except Orlybus and Roissybus) and all Tram line in the Paris region. Imagine "R" Yearly Pass: 350 €, only for students in France for one academic year and under 26: You may travel on every Metro line, all RER (Regional Express Network) and Transilien train lines, all bus lines in the Paris region.
