About the School of Health Sciences Geneva (HEdS)

Our School is part of the HES-SO (Hautes écoles spécialisées – Suisse occidentale) network of Universities of Applied Sciences and Arts Western Switzerland, which represents 28 institutions.

The HEdS Geneva offers 5 Bachelor's degrees for Nursing, Nutrition and Dietetics, Physiotherapy, Midwifery and Radiologic Medical Imaging Technology. These interdisciplinary approaches and teamwork are fundamental aspects of an education that perfectly combines excellence and relevance. Our particular characteristic of Swiss healthcare system is the wide perspectives with a public university hospital and well-known private clinics.

Geneva – crossroad of Europe and home of international organizations- is a multicultural, long-established university city with a significant student population. The HEdS Geneva has its own student house at the disposal of students, enabling them to benefit from our exceptional infrastructure.

The Bachelor's degree is awarded after 3 years of full-time study, preceded by a year of additional modules for those who do not hold a qualification giving them access to the first year of a Bachelor's degree course. The academic calendar is made up of modules which, if successfully completed, are validated by the award of ECTS credits (total = 180). At the end of the course, students are required to produce a Bachelor's thesis.

Spring term (weeks 8 to 37)	June 30th

Due to the increasing number of postulations, the HEdS Geneva will not be able to accept every nominated student. After the relevant deadlines, the HEdS Geneva will select the students and send its decision within one month through an Acceptance Letter.

II. Visa

Our institution will provide information and assistance, when required, for incoming and outgoing students/staff.

As soon as they have received their written confirmation of acceptance, non-EU citizens students/staff should undertake, at least 5-6 months before arrival, the formalities with the Geneva Office Cantonal de la Population <u>https://www.ge.ch/demander-permis-sejour-etudiant</u> in order to obtain on due time the resident permit and the requested visa (via the Swiss embassy of the home country). The HEdS Geneva will take care of the work permit application at the latest 4 months before the beginning of the traineeship.

Applicants from a member state of the European Union or the European Free Trade Association are not required to apply for a student visa. However, a residence permit may be required. The HEdS Geneva will take care of the work permit application at the latest 4 months before the beginning of the traineeship.

III. Insurances

Our institution will provide assistance concerning insurances requirements and will inform incoming students/staff in case insurance cover is not automatically provided.

IV. Housing

The HEdS Geneva will guide incoming student/staff in finding accommodation.

Students studying in Geneva must book their own accommodation as soon as they have received our confirmation of acceptance.

Rooms organized by the HEdS Geneva are allocated in priority to non-EU citizens students. Information and assistance can be provided upon request by the international relations office of the HEdS Geneva.

V. Student Life and Facilities

Thanks to the bilateral agreements established throughout the world, you will find at HEdS Geneva:

- an innovative school of health sciences in an international city on a human scale, with over 160 nationalities living alongside each other, a nearby airport and a lively student community,
- 5 fields of study, an interdisciplinary academic education with one unifying vision: professional and personal exchanges with teachers and students from all over the world,
