	Course offer in German: Students with sufficient German skills may also take classes in German upon agreement. The German course offer can be found <u>here</u> (click on the desired degree programme and 'Studieninhalte' to find the curriculum).
Course selection for incoming students:	If needed, exchange students may mix lectures from different degree programmes, provided there are no time clashes. This does not apply to iLab and EPS. Students interested in Media Technology are asked to choose the EPS or iLab, as capacities of regular courses of the 1 <sup>st</sup> and 2 <sup>nd</sup> year of the bachelor Media Technology are limited.
	Subjects offered in the 1 <sup>st</sup> , 3 <sup>rd</sup> and 5 <sup>th</sup> semester can only be chosen in the winter semester. Subjects offered in the 2 <sup>nd</sup> , 4 <sup>th</sup> and 6 <sup>th</sup> semester can only be chosen in the summer semester.
	Incoming students wishing to take subjects from the master degree programmes must have sufficient knowledge of the respective subjects, as all of these courses are at an advanced level.
