REQUIREMENTS AND DEADLINES

Rule for undergraduate/postgraduate courses

Undergraduate students are best advised to choose courses at university level, while postgraduate students can choose courses at both undergraduate and postgraduate level.

Rules for courses taught in English

- a) The enrolment in any specific <u>course taught in English at Rome Campus cannot be guaranteed and may be</u> <u>subject to availability</u>. Each course taught in English organized at Rome Campus has a limited access to 20/25 Students.
 - Students will be selected based on the date of application and the consistency of the degree path with the content of the degree in which they are enrolled at their home university. The English courses that are offered in Palermo do not have any access restrictions and can be guaranteed.
- b) Incoming Students can choose courses taught in English only if the home University also provides courses taught in English for LUMSA Students. Students must request a confirmation to the International Relations Office of their home University.

Rules for language skills

Erasmus+ incoming Students' language skills must be adequate to the courses they are going to attend.

The sending institution, according to inter-institutional agreement, is responsible for providing support to the nominated students so that they have the recommended language skills at the beginning of the study period:

Language of teaching	Required language knowledge level
Italian	Minimum level required: Italian B1
English	Minimum level required: English B2

Nomination Deadlines

First semester / Full year	from March 1 st to May 31 st
Second semester	from September 1 st to October 31 st

Students' Online Application Deadlines

After the acceptance of their nomination, students receive the Access Code by the LUMSA I.R.O. to complete the online application. The receipt of the submission has to be sent by email together with the following documents:

- Headshot photo in .jpg format;
- Valid Identity Card or Passport;
- Codice fiscale (Italian tax identification number): to be obtained by applying to the Italian Consular authorities in the Country of residence:
- European Health Insurance Card/private insurance;
- Italian and/or English language certificate, depending on the selected language of study;
- Learning Agreement in PDF format only in case the partner University
 is not active on EWP;
- Relevant medical certifications in case of disabilities or special needs.

Italian Language Course	LUMSA International Language and Certification Center (CLIC) offers courses in Italian language and culture. There is a fee of 100€ per level and, if included in the Learning Agreement, students can achieve 4 ECTS credits (non-cumulative). Students can contact the Language Center (clic@lumsa.it) before their arrival to register and receive all the necessary information.
Housing	To support international Students in finding accommodation in Rome, LUMSA University has signed partnerships with some housing platforms. For information, check on the page (Accommodation Università di Roma LUMSA).
Insurance	Students are personally responsible for obtaining insurance coverage for themselves and for their personal belongings. Insurance must be obtained prior to arrival in Italy and must cover costs in the event of illness or accident. EU Students should provide the European Health Insurance Card; Extra EU Students should provide a private insurance. Our institution will, if necessary, provide assistance in securing insurance for incoming and outgoing students and staff in accordance with the requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education.
Visa and Residence Permit for non EU Students	 a) Non EU Students who need a visa (check "il visto per l'Italia.esteri.it), will receive from the I.R.O. a letter of invitation addressed to the Italian Embassy, where they have to apply for a study purpose visa well in advance. b) The Embassy gives the Students the link for the pre-registration (mandatory) on the Universitaly portal (https://www.universitaly.it/) c) Within 8 working days from their arrival in Italy, Students must apply for the Residence Permit, following the instructions given by the I.R.O.
