Recommended language skills

Courses are mainly taught in French. UBO recommends exchange students to have at least a B2 level in French. Very few courses are taught in English, although the course transcript may be in English. Exchange students can enroll for free in French courses at <u>Pôle Langues</u>.

Nomination deadlines:

Information on nominated students must be sent to UBO, using the Excel file, via e-mail at <u>mobilite.internationale@univ-brest.fr</u> by:

Autumn term	15th May 2025
Spring term	15th November 2025

We will accept late nominations until the 15th of June 2025.

Nominations should include:

- a learning agreement signed by the responsible person at the sending institution
- a motivation letter from the student
- the student's level in French

Application deadlines:

Students must have sent in their completed application form to UBO via e-mail at <u>mobilite.internationale@univ-brest.fr</u> by :

Autumn term	15 th June 2025
Spring term	15 th December 2025

We will accept late applications until the 1st of July 2025.

Decision

The receiving institution will send its decision within 6 weeks.

Enrolment:

The students will receive an email containing the registration process, including housing



Transcript of records

A Transcript of Records will be issued no later than 6 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the Université de Bretagne Occidentale.

Academic calendar

Insurance

Students from a Member State of the EU, EEA or Switzerland and entitled to coverage under the social security system of their country, can apply for the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). While the EHIC card gives EU citizens access to medically necessary, state-provided healthcare during a temporary stay, it is NOT an alternative to travel insurance. It does cover NEITHER accidents NOR any private healthcare or costs such as a return flight home country or lost/stolen property.

Housing

Students enrolled in an international exchange program can apply for a room in a student residence hall. All the information about the application is sent by the UBO international office once the student is nominated. There are three residence halls in Brest, all located at walkable distance from the university.
