Language requirements	Our standard entry requirement is B2 level in German language, with the following exceptions: • Master Mining Engineering • Master Computer Science • Intelligent Manufacturing • Master Chemistry • Master Petroleum Engineering These programs are entirely taught in English. Furthermore, numerous classes are given in English or can be requested to be given in English in particular in Materials Science and Engineering as well as in Business and Engineering. Students wishing to enroll only in courses taught in English will not need to provide any German language certificate.

Application procedures

Nomination	Erasmus+ and Worldwide Exchange Students should be nominated by their respective home institutions. Each nomination must contain: • full name • gender • date of birth • email address • cycle of the mobility (Bachelor, Master, Doctorate) • period of the stay Contact <u>Bettina.Sekler@tu-clausthal.de</u> if you require more details of our nomination procedures.
Application process	 When we receive the nomination we will send the student an email containing an invitation to apply to TUC. Applicants are expected to complete the Application Form as well as the Learning Agreement, including making provisional module choices and submitting along with their applications the following scans: Copy of passport/ID One passport size picture German or English language proficiency certificate Health insurance card or private Insurance policy For applicants who meet our basic criteria, we aim to send an acceptance letter ASAP after receiving the student's correct and complete supporting documentation. Module choices are forwarded onto Faculties for consideration. If students are not accepted for all their choices, they will be given the opportunity to select new modules.
Application deadlines	It is important that students apply by the proposed deadline. Applications must be submitted by the following periods: 15 May for students starting in winter semester 15 November for students starting in summer semester Late applications will not be considered.
