Application supporting documents	A completed application must include an <u>application form</u> , recent academic transcript, academic reference on letterheaded paper, and proof of <u>English</u> <u>language</u> proficiency if appropriate. Taught postgraduate applicants must also include a transcript of their undergraduate study.
Entry requirements	For undergraduate applications, candidates should have an average grade of 3.2 (on a US 4.0 GPA scale) or equivalent.
	For postgraduate programmes, applicants must have completed a bachelor's degree with Honours (or equivalent) in a relevant subject, with an overall grade of 2.1 (UK), 2.2 or B+ (Europe), 3.6 GPA (USA) or equivalent and have a strong average grade in their current degree programme.
	All <u>undergraduate</u> and <u>postgraduate</u> candidates whose first language is not English will be expected to meet our <u>English language requirements</u> . Full details, including accepted tests, are available online.
Applying to St Andrews	Undergraduate applicants should <u>apply online</u> . Undergraduate Exchange students must be nominated by their home institution first and will be sent the relevant application link directly.
	Postgraduate applicants should contact the Study Abroad team via email to check whether an application is possible. Applicants will then be sent a Postgraduate Application Form directly which must be returned by email alongside all supporting documents.

Offer of a place	Applicants can normally expect to hear a decision from us via email within four weeks of submitting a complete application. Applicants will be invited through our applicant portal to confirm that they wish to accept their offer of a place.

Travel and Visa

International students <u>travelling</u> to the UK usually require a visa to live and study here. The <u>type</u> <u>of visa you'll need depends</u> on your nationality and the length of your course. Some students do not need a visa. The <u>University's Student Immigration Service</u> provides specialist support to international students who require a visa to study at the University of St Andrews. Please note the UK government introduced a replacement for short term visitor visas in November 2024 called <u>Electronic Travel Authorisation</u> (ETA). Immigration and Healthcare Surcharge

Student visa students	The <u>immigration healthcare surcharge</u> affects all Student Visa students. It is collected by the Home Office at the point of visa application and goes directly to the <u>National Health Service</u> (NHS). Payment of the Surcharge gives migrants access to the NHS on the same terms as permanent UK residents.
Short-Term Study Visa students	Standard Visitor Visa (ETA) students will not be liable for the Surcharge but will be charged for some NHS medical treatments they receive and so they should ensure that they obtain medical insurance before travelling to the UK. Emergency medical care remains free of charge.

English Language Courses

The University offers <u>pre-sessional courses</u>, <u>in-sessional support and modules</u> for students whose first language is not English. Study Abroad students cannot use these <u>courses</u> to satisfy the University's English language requirements. Courses exist to help ensure enrolled students are academically successful.

Academic Information

Course catalogue & information	The <u>course catalogue</u> has information about all available modules, including a brief description of content, credits, level, semester availability, contact hours and independent study hours, and assessment. Get in touch with us if you would like further information on any of our modules to help your students prepare.
Course load	A <u>standard full-time course load</u> is 60 credits (30 ECTS credits) per semester, though students may be approved for 50 to 70 credits (25-35 ECTS credits) per semester on an individual basis with approval from the home institution.
Modules (courses)	Most modules are 10, 15, 20 or 30 credits, so students might take fewer classes than at home (e.g., two 30 credit modules), but each module has a high workload. One credit represents 10 notional hours of learner effort. Modules at first and second year level (1000 and 2000, e.g. AS1101 or AS2101) are known as 'sub-Honours', while modules at third and fourth year level (3000 and 4000, e.g. IR3022 or IR4401) are known as 'Honours'. Level 5000 modules (e.g. CS5014) are taught at a postgraduate level and are not open to undergraduates. Study abroad and exchange students are not eligible to take modules from the School of Medicine or evening modules. Students attending St Andrews through a subject-specific exchange are expected to take at least one module per semester in the subject of the exchange. Please notify us of the exchange subject at the point of nomination.
Enrolment & academic advising	Students will be asked to complete pre-advising online, but course enrolments will only be finalised during Academic Advising , when students will have the opportunity to discuss their programme with an Academic Adviser. Attendance at this in-person appointment is mandatory. Read FAQs here .

Accommodation

Applying for accommodation	Undergraduate exchange and study abroad students are guaranteed University accommodation if they apply by Accommodation Service deadlines . Applicants can apply from 1st March for September 2025 entry.
	Students will only be invited to <u>apply for accommodation</u> 48 hours after receiving and accepting either a conditional or unconditional <u>offer</u> to study at St Andrews.
	Confirmation of allocated accommodation is sent to incoming students throughout the summer period (for semester one or full year entry) and January (for semester two entry).

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St Andrews Summer Study

St Andrews Summer Study offers international undergraduate students from around the world the opportunity to spend 3-4 weeks studying at the University of St Andrews, enabling students to experience the academic rigour and feel of St Andrews and Scotland, first-hand. Learning takes place inside and outside the classroom as courses integrate field trips and environmental learning into the curriculum. There is an additional social programme of activities and excursions alongside their studies allowing students to experience Scotland's culture, famous cities and stunning landscapes. All courses are credit-bearing, meaning that students may be able to transfer credits back to their home institution. In 2025, we have three summer courses running: our 3-week residential courses (7 - 28 June 2025) Scotland's History: Kingdom, Nation, People is offered by the School of History with the inclusion of a new Student-Athlete Global leadership course taught by the International Education and Lifelong Learning Institute (IELLI). Medieval History also offer a 4-week (7 June - 5 July 2025) archaeological fieldwork course, Monastic Scotland with the opportunity to take part in excavations at Lindores Abbey (12th century monastery).
