Language of instruction	<b>French.</b> Some courses are taught in English (please see program). Good knowledge and skills in French are required to follow engineering or M.Sc. courses at Centrale Lyon ENISE (at least a level B1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages [CEFR]).		
	International M1 and M2 M.Sc. courses are taught <b>in English</b> (at least a B1 level is required).		
French Language Courses	French courses are included in all study programs for non-French-speaking students. Double degree engineering students must pass at least level B2 at the end of their stay at Centrale Lyon ENISE (the grade obtained for FLE - French as a Foreign Language - will be considered as proof).		
English Language	All double degree engineering students must have a minimum knowledge of English: no beginner-level English courses are available in the study programs.  Students enrolled in the Engineering double degree and the Engineering degree must pass one of the following exams in order to be admitted to the degree:

ECTS (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System)

Full-time student workload:

- 30 ECTS per semester
- 60 ECTS per academic year

Depending on the course, 1 ECTS corresponds to more or less 30 hours of work; half of these hours are spent in class.

The evaluation grid ranges from  $A \ge 14$  excellent to F < 10 Insufficient. Scores range from 0 to 20. The minimum average to pass is 10. It may be possible to pass with an 8, if this is validated by the jury.

At Centrale Lyon ENISE, the score of 20 is extremely rare. Scores of 15-20 are rare, and 14 and above are considered excellent.


## Specialized Engineering Program under student status

For each year, the range of courses is organized into constituent elements (EC) grouped into teaching units (UE). The UEs are centered on a domain, itself integrated into a wider field (figure below).

The educational program consists of 60 ECTS credits per year of study, i.e. 120 ECTS credits in the preparatory program and 180 ECTS credits at the end of the Centrale Lyon ENISE engineering program. The program listing all the UEs and ECs is described in the syllabus.

Before the end of the fifth year of study, it is compulsory to spend at least 1 semester abroad (in the form of an internship, laboratory placement or academic semester).

At least 3 academic semesters must be completed at Centrale Lyon ENISE during the engineering cycle. Any departure abroad may be subject to validation of credits by the jury. If a student leaves with non-validated ECTS credits, he assumes the entire burden related to the validation and the presence of the remedial exams.



	STUDENT LIFE
Accommodation	The residences selected by the School and recommended to the student during registration are private ones. Centrale Lyon ENISE has no control over the allocation of these accommodations. Students will be invited to read our selection and check their choice in the space provided. The School may contact a housing professional to discuss a possible allocation.  Most residences require a guarantor, for example CROUS residences. The amounts of the aid are calculated on a case-by-case basis, depending on the amount of the rent. Requests for assistance must be completed on the website of the Family Allowance Fund (CAF) after arrival at Centrale Lyon ENISE, within 3 months of taking possession of the room or studio. During the process, the person concerned will be asked for French banking identities.

University restaurant	The university restaurant is a 5-minute walk away, in a building that also houses the Jean Monnet University.  Cost of meals per student: €3.30 *  *Price may vary. Visa / Residence permit	Students from non-European countries must apply for a student visa/residence permit before entering France. Even if they live in an EU country, they must apply for a student visa at the French consulate/embassy of the country where they reside.  There are several types of visa. The VLS-TS visa applies to all international students wishing to enroll in a French higher education institution (except for Algerian nationals). The VLS-TS visa is valid for 1 year.  After their arrival in France, the International Relations Department helps students with visa formalities relating to their stay in France.  Information and application forms can be obtained from the French embassy or consulate in the country of origin. 	All students must be fully covered for their entire stay in France.
Health insurance	Students from EU/EEA countries must have their European Health Insurance Card or a certificate of private insurance offering full coverage in case of a medical problem. The EHIC card does not mean that additional insurance is not necessary.  Non-European students must be registered to the social security system. Once students arrive and are registered at Centrale Lyon ENISE, they must complete the free online procedure: <a href="https://etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr/#/">https://etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr/#/</a> They also have the option of subscribing to supplementary health insurance.  It is mandatory to subscribe to a private health insurance for at least one month before registration and arrival at Centrale Lyon ENISE.
Civil liability insurance	It is compulsory for all students enrolled at Centrale Lyon ENISE to take out <b>civil liability insurance</b> in order to be covered for any damage they may unintentionally cause to others or to equipment, they may damage during their stay at Centrale Lyon ENISE.
