HEALTH & TRAVEL INSURANCE

All exchange students coming to SETU Waterford are advised to take out comprehensive health and travel insurance before coming to Ireland. Private health and travel insurance may be obtained either from the student's home country or from an Irish provider. Students should be advised that participation in the Erasmus+ programme abroad involves certain inherent risks which the exchange student must assume. The risks associated include, but are not limited to, responsibility for damage to or loss of property, personal illness or injury and death while the exchange student is a participant in the programme. Although SETU Waterford takes all necessary steps to mitigate these risks and to provide assistance in time of need, the student must take responsibility for ensuring personal safety and security during the study placement. Students must assume responsibility for taking out adequate personal travel and health insurance.

STUDY PROGRAMME

Module Selection

Exchange students may select modules from the SETU Waterford ECTS Module Guides <u>only</u>. The SETU Waterford ECTS Module Guides can be found <u>here</u>. The maximum number of ECTS credits students can study per semester is 30 and the minimum is 15. The majority of modules at SETU Waterford are worth 5 ECTS. Modules have between 3-4 hours of classes each week.

IMPORTANT: Module availability is subject to capacity. Please be advised that <u>timetables</u> are released at the start of the semester.

Please note; during orientation there will be a mandatory session for students on how to create a specific timetable.

English Language Requirements

Exchange students are not required to submit proof of their English language proficiency. Partner institutions are expected to select students who have the required standard of English as set out in our inter-institutional agreement.

Please note; non-EU citizens that require a study visa may be required to show proof of English Language proficiency when applying for a study visa to study in Ireland. Check <u>here</u> for further information.

English Language Modules for Exchange Students

SETU Waterford offers three English language modules worth 5 ECTS each at the following levels:

- B2
- C1.1
- C1.2

IMPORTANT: Please be advised we cannot guarantee classes are scheduled every semester due to resource limitations. If they are scheduled, the student will be advised of this during the induction programme. Places are limited and cannot be guaranteed and are awarded on a first come first serve basis.

Students can attend <u>one</u> level only and they are required to attend <u>all</u> 3 hours of classes per week.

Exam and Assessment Registration

Students are generally given two weeks from the start of semester before a "Module Registration Form" must be submitted to the Office for International Relations. This form is provided to the Examinations and Registry Departments to register the student for exams.

Exam timetables are released between 4-6 weeks prior to the exams.

VISA REQUIREMENTS

The Office for International Relations at SETU Waterford provides information and support to **non-European students** regarding arranging their study permits. A visa workshop will be held as part of the international student orientation programme.

If a prospective exchange student is a non-EU citizen, a **Visa Support Letter** is required and can be provided by the SETU Waterford Office for International Relations. Once student's online application has been completed, please email <u>studentexchange.WD@setu.ie</u> to request a Visa Support Letter. Please see <u>here</u> for more information on visas.

STUDENT ORIENTATION PROGRAMME

Our student <u>orientation</u> programme is **mandatory** for <u>all</u> international exchange students. Online Orientation dates to be confirmed. We will email all accepted students the orientation programme schedule and this will also be available on our website 2-3 weeks before the start of semester.
