Languages of instruction and levels	Bachelors' degree: generally taught in French, B1 level required. Masters' degree: For regular courses in French and for courses taught in English, B1 level required for both languages.		
EILC (Erasmus Intensive Language Courses)	20 hours of free intensive French language courses (FLE) per semester are available to international students at both levels. The aim is to help them to fully assimilate and experience the study of architecture in French.

Period of integration	Exchange students are encouraged to attend our Welcome Day during the first days of each semester. In September, the opening sessions of each degree (Bachelor3 & Master1) are also an opportunity to meet all the teaching staff. Two 'adaptation weeks' are offered to exchange students to allow them to integrate, familiarise themselves and modify their programme at the beginning of each semester.				
Exchange students' program proposals	In agreement with their home university and depending on the program schedules, Master students may combine courses/projects at both the Bachelor's and Master's level.				
Students' accommodation with CROUS (center of students' welfare organisation)	In partnership with the CROUS housing department, ÉNSA Versailles provides available units in 3 CROUS residence halls for exchange students applying during the specified dates (2 residences in Versailles and 1 at one RER station to Versailles). Please note that as our quotas are limited, we cannot respond to all requests. In addition, online applications are managed directly by the CROUS.
