

MOBILITY PROGRAMMES

Incoming exchange students

Students coming to Venice for a mobility period, within the framework of an interinstitutional mobility agreement.
Our mobility programmes are: Erasmus+ KA131, Erasmus+ KA171, Overseas and SEMP.

Double or joint degree students

Students coming to Venice for a mobility period, within the framework of a dual or joint degree agreement.

After their mobility, students will obtain the qualification from both their Home University and Ca' Foscari (double degree) or a joint diploma validated by all the partner institutions involved in the programme (joint degree).

Incoming visiting students (free movers)

Students enrolled in a foreign University, coming to Venice for a mobility period as free movers (not under an existing mobility agreement).

EUTOPIA

Ca' Foscari is part of <u>EUTOPIA</u>, an alliance of 10 European universities sharing a vision and collaborating to build the universities of the future. Within this framework, Ca' Foscari hosts incoming exchange students from other partner universities in the alliance.

EUTOPIA also promotes specific projects, such as <u>ECOTOPIA</u>, a mobility programme focused on topics such as economics, management, business and sustainability.

No specific deadline for nomination and application procedures is envisaged. However, partner institutions are encouraged to proceed as soon as possible in order to allow students to prepare for their mobility and find an accommodation in due time.

REGISTRATION AND APPLICATION PROCEDURE

After the official nomination, students are contacted by the staff in charge and invited to complete an online registration procedure.

To complete their applications, students should prepare beforehand and submit the following documents:

- Copy of ID or Passport (compulsory)
- B2 language certificate (compulsory) not required for native speakers
- Transcript of records English version
- Erasmus students only are required to select at least the 70% of their courses amongst the ones of their study field.
- Entry qualification (only for Double and Joint degree students)



TUITION FEES

Incoming exchange students (Erasmus+KA131, Erasmus+ KA171 ICM, Overseas, SEMP, EUTOPIA, ECOTOPIA) and incoming double and joint degree students

Incoming exchange students coming to Venice in the framework of the Erasmus+, SEMP or Overseas programmes are not required to pay tuition fees at Ca' Foscari University of Venice.

As a general rule, incoming double and joint degree students are not required to pay tuition fees at Ca' Foscari University of Venice, unless otherwise specified in the relevant agreement.

Incoming visiting students

LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

Incoming exchange students (Erasmus+ KA131, Erasmus+ KA171 ICM, Overseas, SEMP, EUTOPIA, ECOTOPIA) and incoming visiting students

A proof of B2 level English language proficiency is required for enrolment. Students willing to attend courses taught in Italian, should also prove a B2 level Italian language proficiency. Native speakers or students coming from partner universities where English or Italian is the language of instruction do not need to prove their proficiency. VISA AND RESIDENCE PERMIT

Non-EU citizens need to apply for a visa for study purposes (mobility) in order to enter the country. The application must be submitted through the national <u>Universitaly</u> portal.

Upon arrival in Italy, non-EU students also need to apply for an Italian residence permit for study purposes (mobility). Ca' Foscari University, in cooperation with the local Immigration Office (Questura), has established UNI-QUEST, a help desk to support the University's international community in applying for or renewing their residence permit. Non-EU citizens residing in an EU country with a valid residence permit, might not need to apply for an Italian visa/residence permit.

COURSES

Registration is not required for attending courses (except when specified, in exceptional cases), but it is mandatory for taking exams.

A comprehensive list of the courses offered by our University can be found at this link. (Be mindful to set the right academic year for a correct research!) The main languages of instruction are Italian and English.

Incoming exchange students (Erasmus+ KA131, Erasmus+ KA171 ICM, Overseas, SEMP, EUTOPIA, ECOTOPIA) and incoming visiting students

Incoming exchange students can attend courses offered within first cycle (Bachelor) and second cycle (Master) degree programmes, upon approval of the Learning Agreement by both institutions.

Incoming exchange students are free to select all the courses from the course catalogue, **except for**:

- PHD courses
- "Minor" courses
- Collegio Internazionale courses (Centro di Eccellenza)
- courses providing 0 credits
- "interateneo" courses (i.e. held in other universities except for BA Degree Programme Ancient Civilization for Contemporary World, which is now open to international students starting from the Academic Year 2025/2026)
- · courses from the BA Digital Management
- courses from the BA Linguistic and Cultural Mediation (Mediazione Linguistica Culturale)
- Foundation Year courses
- Vocational masters' courses (Master di I e Il livello)
- CM0609 FIS/07 Experimental Biophysics
- CM0610 ING-INF/06 Foundations of information theory and computational

- neurosciences
- CM0611 BIO/09 Integrative Neurophysiology

NB: Ca' Foscari offers 12 ECTS courses that, in some cases, are divided into 2 modules worth 6 ECTS each (6 + 6 ECTS). Students interested in these courses must be aware that both modules are mandatory in order to obtain credits.

For example, the 12 ECTS course EM1A13 MODERN AND CONTEMPORARY ART is made of two modules worth 6 ECTS out of 12 each. Students willing to take this course must sit the exams for both modules.

Erasmus+KA131 students only (except for EUTOPIA and ECOTOPIA exchange students) should comply with the following rules for the course selection: 70% of the chosen courses must belong to the study field of the agreement under which they have been nominated; the remaining 30% can be selected with no restrictions, apart from those specified above.

Incoming double and joint degree students

Incoming students participating in a double or joint degree programme will be enrolled in a specific BA or MA programme. The study plan will have to be defined and agreed upon with the



ECTS AND GRADING SYSTEM

What is an ECTS?

The European Credit Transfer System (ECTS) is a university credit transfer system commonly used across Europe, aiming at guaranteeing a transparent and efficient recognition of the exams students take during their international mobility periods.

Ca' Foscari University has recognized the equivalence between the credit system adopted in the Italian education system and the ECTS system, as follows:

1 CFU (Credito Formativo Universitario) = 1 ECTS

Grading system in Italy

The Italian grading system works on a scale ranging from 18/30 to 30/30. 18 is the lowest passing grade and 30 is the highest grade. In case of particularly outstanding performances, Professors can assign the so-called "lode" (30 cum laude - 30L).

Students will obtain credits, only if they successfully pass the relevant exam. Failed exams will not be reported in the students final Transcript of Records and will not provide any credit.

The Transcript of records lists the passed exams, only if they have been approved in the Learning Agreement beforehand.

ITALIAN LANGUAGE AND CULTURE COURSES AT SIE

Ca' Foscari School for International Education (SIE) organizes free Italian language courses for non-native speakers, as well as courses in Italian and Venetian culture, history, art and literature, specifically designed for international exchange students spending a study period at Ca' Foscari University.

All **incoming exchange students** (Erasmus+ KA131, Erasmus+ KA171 ICM, Overseas, SEMP, EUTOPIA, ECOTOPIA) are eligible to attend them.

Double and joint degree students can attend the courses, prior approval of the programme's academic coordinators at both institutions.

In addition, the SIE also offers standard Italian courses held by highly qualified native speakers. The courses cover all levels, from A1 to C2 of the CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages). In cooperation with the Università per Stranieri di Siena, SIE is an accredited center for the CILS examinations and also offers preparation for the CILS exam.
