Admission procedures for foreign students coming to the Ensa-PB

Conditions of	We recommend that students integrate the Ensa-PB at the beginning of the first semester
admission	in September. Students can come for the third year of study (Bachelor's Degree) or for the first year of the Master's degree, although it is also possible to come for the fifth year of study (second year of the Master's degree). (Students coming for the fifth year of study are required to take courses in the Master 1 program or will be able to work on their thesis in semester 2 under the supervision of a
	teacher from their home university and a teacher from Ensa-PB). In all cases, students are required to enroll in the courses offered in the year for which they are registered and will have to respect the functioning of the studies of the Ensa-PB.
	IMPORTANT: At Ensa-PB, it is not possible to choose courses from different years.

IMPORTANT	The student must have acquired a sufficient command of the french language, level B1 recommended.
Mandatory	The student's level of French will be certified as follows:
	- For Erasmus exchange students: their OLS test results For non-Erasmus exchange students: a certificate from their university coordinator.
	A certified level of French lower than B1 will not be grounds for refusing the student's mobility. They will be encouraged to take intensive and extensive French courses and will be limited in studio and course allocations.
Mandatory	Please note Master's seminar: Master's students who are required to take the 'seminar' must present a B1 level language certificate.
Application procedure and deadlines for nominations /registrations	The home university nominates students to the ENSA-PB's international exchanges department by e-mail and then receives the nomination procedure online. The student then receives the link that will allow them to register online.
	Deadline for online nominations by the university: 1st semester: April, 11th 2025
	2nd semester: October, 17th 2025
	Deadline for online registration by students: 1st semester : April, 25th 2025
	2nd semester : October, 31th 2025
	A certificate of admission to Ensa-PB will be sent to the students.
Language of	All classes are taught in French.
instruction	1 Master's Studio is taught in English and some master's studio teachers are identified as 'English friendly'. (exchange students are not given priority as it is also offered to Ensa-PB students).
French for architect course	- Intensive French for architect course take place in August/September (optional, 30 hours of lessons, NO ECTS credits).
	- Extensive French for architect course are proposed at each semester. They are part of the bachelor's or master's programme. 22 hours of lessons (2 ECTS credit)
	They are free and organized by the school.
Academic calendar	The academic year, divided in two semesters, lasts 10 months. It runs from late August/September to mid-June.
	1st semester: September 2025 to January 2026 2nd semester: January 2026 to June 2026

Pedagogical	A course registration form is available before the beginning of each semester, students will
registration	be asked to classify studio and course choices in order of preference. The school cannot necessarily honor the first or second choice sometimes even the 3rd choice
	- Students are required to enroll in the courses offered in the year for which they are registered.
	- Students must respect the structure of the Ensa-PB Bachelor 3 and Master program. At Ensa-PB, it is not possible to choose courses from different years.

	Students attendance is required: - all studio sessions and course
	- at the start of every course in each semester with the INTRODUCTIVE/INTENSIVE week.
	- at the exams at the end of each course of each semester with the "INTENSIVE" week.
Internship in a French agency	Students who wish to benefit from a professional experience through an internship must establish an agreement between their home university and the host agency in France. The days and hours of the internship should not be a substitute for the student's class schedule. It will not be possible to establish an agreement with Ensa-PB.
Learning agreement (for Erasmus+ students)	The draft learning agreement for the year 2025-2026 is established before the arrival of the students. The final pedagogical contract will be established after the pedagogical registration period
Draft course outline (For non-ERASMUS students)	A draft course outline for the 2025-2026 year will be requested before students arrive.
Grading	At Ensa-PB, a semester is validated by 30 ECTS credits.
	If the course of plan has fewer than 30 ECTS credits, the agreement of the partner university is required. However, we ask students to take courses for a minimum of 20 ECTS credits.
	The ENSA-PB uses the ECTS (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System). Student work is evaluated with letter-grades. Student results are documented with a ENSA-PB specific grade (Local grade)

	Civil liability Insurance Students must take out civil liability insurance to cover any damage they may cause to others. This insurance is MANDATORY and must be taken in France (approximately 15 euros). Without it, students will not be allowed to enter Ensa-PB.
