	its partner institutions to evaluate their student's English proficiency and make sure that			
	the level is sufficient to cope with the study programme. A specific minimum le			
	English may be specified in the exchange agreement between your home instituti THUAS.			
Grading System	Each module or subject taught at The Hague University of Applied Sciences is worth a			
	number of ECTS. One ECTS credit represents 28 hours of fulltime study. The Dutch			
	grading scale consists of numbers	ranging from 1 to 10, where 1 is the lowest	grade, 10	
	the highest and 5,5 the lowest passing grade.
