Nomination Procedure

Students from partner universities must be nominated by their home institution using the <u>online form.</u>

Partner Universities: please ensure you have confirmed the number of available spaces for your institution **prior** to submission of nominees.

Upon nomination, the International Partnerships Office will confirm receipt directly to the partner contact via email.

Nomination Deadlines

- Tri A or Full-Year Exchange: 1st May
- Tri B Exchange: 1st October

Nomination Requirements

- Student must have completed one full-year of studies prior to joining GCU
- Student must be at least 18 years of age

Term Dates

Tri A: September - January

Tri B: January - May

Application Procedure

Application Deadlines

- Tri A or Full-Year Exchange: 15th May
- Tri B Exchange: 15th October

Application Requirements: Completion of the online form in addition to submission of supporting documents:

- Copy of <u>Active</u> Passport
- Transcript of Records
- Letter of Motivation (500 words)
- English language certificate
 - ◊ For students studying for a *single semester (less than 6 months)*, we can accept a supporting letter from the sending institution that confirms appropriate English language levels (CEFR equivalent of B2 or above).
 - For students studying for over 6 months, please see our webpage for the certificates we can accept.

Drop-In Sessions with the International Partnerships Office During the application round, the IPO host bookable drop-in sessions for applicants to guide them through the process.

Application Response: Students will receive confirmation of receipt of an application once the application deadline has passed.

Application Review: Applications will be reviewed during the week after the application deadline. Formal acceptance letters will be sent to students who have completed the application in full within 2 weeks of the application deadline.

Modules at GCU

Terminology

At GCU, we use the term **module**; however, your home university may refer to these as 'components' or 'courses'.

Credits

- GCU uses the SCOTCAT credit system, where 1 ECTS = 2 SCOTCAT credits.
- Most modules at GCU are worth 20 SCOTCAT credits (10 ECTS)
- A full workload for a semester is 60 SCOTCAT credits = 30ECTS (3 modules)

Module Lists

After you have applied to GCU using the online form, you will be provide the list of available modules on offer for your exchange period. This list of modules has been approved by academics at GCU and students are only able to choose modules that are noted on these lists, unless prior permission is sought.

Module Choices

Using the list of available modules, and the links to the module catalogue, students will be asked to submit an online form noting 6 preference modules (per semester).

Module Choice Review

After submission, students 6 module preferences will then be reviewed by academic members of staff using the transcript of records provided at application stage. The timetabling team will also review preferences to ensure that there are no clashes. You will then receive confirmation for **3** of your module preferences from GCU's Central Academic Support Team.





Visa and Immigration Requirements

For students of any nationality studying for 6 months or more—<u>a student visa</u> is required.

For students studying for 6 months or less, you should enter the UK on a <u>Standard</u> <u>Visit Visa</u>. Dependent on your nationality, you may be required to apply for this in advance of travel:

- Visa Nationals—apply in advance
- Non-Visa Nationals—apply on entry to the UK

The above notes have been provided for information purposes only. Upon successful application, students will receive visa advice specific to their individual situation.
