

NOMINATION OF EXCHANGE STUDENTS

Please, attach the <u>nomination form</u> at the following email address **erasmus@uoa.gr**

In the email's subject please type "Nomination Form" and the Erasmus Code of your university!

The nominations are processed only if they are sent by the Partner University and not by the nominated student(s).

The nomination is not equal to Acceptance Letter.

Thus, the nominated students must book their transportation tickets to Greece and make the necessary accommodation arrangements only after receiving the official Acceptance Letter.

NOMINATION DEADLINES

Winter semester: May 15th, 2025 Full year exchange: May 15th, 2025 Spring semester: October 15th, 2025

*In case the Erasmus+ outgoing student's selection period in your university is different from the ones listed above, please let us know before the end of the deadlines.

** Nominations must comply with the terms of each Erasmus agreement with regard to the area of studies, level of studies and number of students.

For any possible change to the above areas, you have to ask for our approval beforehand.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Once we have received the nominations from the Home University Erasmus Office, our Department will send your students the relevant link to the online application form along with all related information.

They should submit the application online together with all supporting documents by the following deadlines:

Winter semester: from April 15th, 2025 to June 15th, 2025

Full year Exchange: from April 15th, 2025 to June 15th, 2025

Spring semester: from September 15th, 2025 to November 15th, 2025

DOCUMENTS TO BE UPLOADED ALONG WITH THE ONLINE APPLICATION FORM

The nominated students must upload on **our** university online application platform the following documents:

1. Learning Agreement duly signed by the student and both academic coordinators.

2. A readable copy of their **Passport or ID** (must be valid for the entire Erasmus period).

3. A readable copy of their **European Health Insurance Card** or of a Private Health Insurance Contract (must be valid for the entire Erasmus period).

4. A readable copy of their **Transcript of Records** (document of their academic performance).

After the submission of the application form along with the required documents, the formal Acceptance Letter will be sent within 4 weeks.





The academic year at the NKUA runs from the end of September to the beginning of July. During the summer months indicative dates for the academic year **2025-26** will be announced. However, the dates will not change significantly from the **2024-25** dates.

STUDYING AT NKUA

Course information: The up-to-date online course catalogue is available approximately two months before the beginning of each semester. To get an idea of the offered courses, students should consult the catalogue of previous years and faculty websites.

Erasmus+ students should choose courses mainly from their registration Department. In addition, they can choose up to two courses from another Department of NKUA after having firstly the approval of both academic coordinators (home and host) and the Professor(s), who teaches the course(s).

Online course catalogue: Most courses are conducted in the Greek language. In various Departments there are courses offered in English (and/or in other languages). In Departments that courses are conducted only/mainly in Greek, there are special arrangements for the Erasmus+ students. The most common one is the assgignement of essays written in English with the use of English bibliography. A significant number of postgraduate courses are offered in English and some in other languages(French, German, Spanish, Italian).

No attendanship certificates will be provided after each course.

LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

The nominated students should meet our language requirements (minimum requirement in Greek or in English language: B2) as defined in the bilateral agreements.

Students that will participate in postgraduate courses must comply with the required language level of the specific postgraduate course.

GRADING SYSTEM

The Greek University grading system runs from 0 to 10 and it has the following ranges:

Passing grades are from 5 to 10: **Excellent:** 8.50 - 10.00 **Vey good:** 6.5 - 8.49 **Good:** 5.00 - 6.49

WELCOME DAY

It is strongly suggested that all the incoming students should participate in the Welcome Day, organized by the Department of European and International Relations at the beginning of each semester (September and February).

GENERAL INFORMATION

VISA PROCESS

Incoming students, who are coming from non-EU countries or need to apply for VISA due to their citizenship, have to take the necessary steps prior to their arrival in Greece. Information on students whose citizenship requires a VISA in order to come to Greece can be found at the website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

Students from Non-EU countries who will stay for a period longer than 3 months, as soon as they arrive in Athens have to apply for a residence permit at the competent Aliens and Immigration Department.


