Dates & Deadlines

Semester 1 and Full Year nominations open: **15th March**

Semester 1 and Full Year Nominations close: **15th April**

Semester 1 and Full Year Applications close: **1st May**

Semester 2 Nominations open: **15th September**

Semester 2 Nominations: **15th October**

Semester 2 Applications: **1st November**

All nominations are handled via our Online System, Mobility Online.

A nomination link will be circulated to partners on 15th March 2025 and 15th September 2025

Required documents

- Passport information page
- English language document (if not a native speaker)
- Transcript **in English**:

*-Students coming for **one semester only** may have their transcript officially translated by their Home University*

-Students who will be studying in Liverpool for the full year must provide transcripts translated by an official, notarized translator

Inbound Application Process



1. Partner to nominate student individually online (**A nomination link will be circulated to partners on 15th March 2025 and 15th September 2025**).
2. Student will receive an automated email within 24 hours of nomination asking them to complete Stage 1 of our application (Stage 1 application instructions will be included).
3. The student will receive information (via email) on how to complete Stage 2 of the application within two weeks of them completing stage 1 (this time frame shortens later in the semester).
4. Global Opportunities Team inform student of the outcome of their application and issue offer letter from mid-April & mid-October.
5. Students can then select modules for academic approval (Stage 3)
6. Global Opportunities Team inform student of the outcome of their module selection. *Please note that receiving academic approval does not confirm that students will be registered for that module; timetable clashes or and capacity issues may arise. Timetables will be released roughly 2 weeks before the start of the semester.*

English Language Requirements

All students who are not native English speakers must show that they have a minimum level of English. A full list of accepted qualifications can be found here:

Non-native English-speaking students studying at the University of Liverpool for less than 6 months may may use our **English Qualification Form** as proof of their level of English, and can upload this completed form to their application in lieu of a formal qualification. Please note, we can only accept our own version of this document, a blank copy will be sent to every student as part of their application.

Full Year students who are not native English-speakers but are studying at exchange partners in the **USA, Australia or New Zealand** and have completed a **full year** of studies at the partner university at the **time of application** may, in lieu of a formal qualification, provide a satisfactory signed reference on **official university letter headed paper** from their Home University which comments on the ability of the student **across the 4 components** of English Language.

Visa information

Students who are studying with us for less than 6 months may not need to apply for a visa before travelling to the UK, if they are eligible to apply for an ETA (Electronic Travel Authorisation), please [see here](#) for details.

All students who will study at the University of Liverpool for a Full Academic Year will require a Student Visa. Offer Letters and Student Visa CAS Statements are produced by the Global Opportunities Team and sent directly to the students' email address. Please note, we cannot produce a CAS for any student studying with us for one semester only.

Please note.

Students from the US, Canada, Hong Kong, India and Singapore who are studying in Liverpool for Semester 1 only may sit written in-person exams at their home campus. All other students must be present in Liverpool. **ALL** students are required to sit Semester 2 exams in Liverpool.

Semester 1 exam results are usually published in mid-March, transcripts will be sent directly to partners by the end of April. Semester 2 exam results are usually released at the start of July, transcripts will be sent directly to partners by mid-August.

Accommodation

Semester-only students

Students staying in Liverpool for a single semester can apply for an on-campus room. Many of our on-campus rooms are in Melville Grove, Tudor Close and Vine Court (self-catered, single study bedroom with shared kitchen). Vine Court offers en-suite rooms and some [semi-catered options](#).

- In Semester 1, on-campus accommodation is competitive, and rooms are assigned by lottery – around 80% of students are placed. Accommodation in the private sector in Semester 1 can be hard to find.
- In Semester 2 we guarantee accommodation
- Visiting (fee paying) students are guaranteed on-campus accommodation in both semesters

Students also note that the contract and cost for the University halls of residence will cover the whole semester, even if the student returns home early.

Full year students:

Students staying for a full year will be guaranteed accommodation in any UoL Hall of Residence of their choosing.

Finance

Living expenses in Liverpool are low compared to many other UK cities. Students are advised to budget between £9,000 and £10,000 to live in Liverpool for a full academic year. This includes accommodation, food and local travel.

For 2025/26, exchange students will be required to pay a social fee of £10. This cost helps to fund [our events and social programme](#). Visiting (fee paying) students are not required to pay the social fee.

Students with disabilities

The Global Opportunities Team and Disability Advice and Guidance (DAG) work closely together to make sure that students with a disability, specific learning difficulty or long-term health condition are supported within their academic studies. Please declare your disability, specific learning difficulty or long-term health condition on your application form so that the University can help you get a support plan in place before your arrival.

Travel Insurance

Students are expected to arrange their Travel Insurance and Health insurance in their own country.

Students studying for more than 6 months will pay the Immigration Health Surcharge (IHS) (as referred to on gov.uk) in order to access healthcare through the National Health Service (NHS)



Buddy Scheme

The Global Opportunities Team organise a “Buddy Scheme” to help students to integrate to the University community. Students can opt into the scheme via our application form.

Fees for 2025/26:

Full year: £18,480

Semester: £10,080

Visiting students from one of our partner universities will be eligible for a 10% tuition discount.

Summer 2025/26

The International Summer School and Summer Research Project will run in 2026. SRP is a competitive application process with students selected by the academic project lead. The ISS is open recruitment with no GPA requirements.

On-campus accommodation is guaranteed for both programmes irrespective of duration.

If students from your institution are eligible to take up exchange places (at a rate of one 3-week ISS block to 0.25 semester or one SRP place to 0.5 Semester) you will be notified in advance; otherwise we are happy to accept fee paying individuals or groups.
