Libraries and collections

With two main libraries (one on each campus) as well as fourteen specialized libraries, Université Lumière Lyon 2 has a collection well over 450 000 books. We receive physical copies of over 1 500 scientific journals as well as approximately 100 online databases. Our libraries also offer access to thousands of master and doctoral theses.

On-campus restaurants

Each campus has a university restaurant where meals may be purchased for approximately 3,30 €. There are also university cafeterias on both campuses.

Visa and immigration policies

Only the nationals of non-EEC member countries are required to have a long-stay student visa ("visa de long séjour étudiant"). Applications for student visas must be submitted to the French consulate serving the student's current residence following the reception of their acceptance letter

INCOMING EXCHANGE STUDENTS



NOMINATION AND APPLICATION PROCESS

Step 1: Nomination by partner university

Nomination Period for:

- Autumn semester (September to January): Nominations should be submitted between March 15th and April 15th
- Spring semester (January to May): Nominations should be submitted between August 25th and September 30th

Step 2: Online student application

Following the reception of student nominations, students will receive an email with a link to the online application form. Students must complete their application:

- fall semester by 5th May
- spring semester by 15th October

Step 3: Acceptance letter

The process is different for World and Europe students:

- Acceptance letters for World students will be sent directly to the partner university, either by email or postal mail. Students will also receive an electronic copy via email.
- Erasmus students will receive their acceptance letter directly via email.

Tuition fees

There are no tuition fees for exchange students.

INCOMING EXCHANGE STUDENTS



CLASSES OPEN TO EXCHANGE STUDENTS

Exchange students are allowed to select any course from regular undergraduate programs (L1 to L3) and master's program classes (M1).

However, students are not permitted to enroll in courses from professional undergraduate programs (L2 & L3 pro), university technical degree programs (DUT), or DU program classes.

European credit transfer system (ECTS) earned :

5 ECTS credits are awarded for each validated course at Université Lumière Lyon 2.

FRENCH AS A FOREIGN LANGUAGE COURSE

Exchange students have the opportunity to enroll in French as a foreign language classes at our International Centre for French Studies (Centre International d'Etudes Françaises) which specializes in French-language learning for non-native French speakers. PHYSICAL ACTIVITIES FOR A GRADE OR FOR FUN

STUDENT ACCOMMODATION

While filling out their online application, exchange students may request a room in a public student residence (Crous).

Notifications regarding student residence allocations will be sent to students arriving for the :

- Autumn semester in early July
- Spring semester in early December

While we are unable to allocate a spot in public university housing to all students who request one, we guide students in finding accommodation in the private housing market or in accommodation shared with other students. Rent for a private accommodation: approximately **500€ to 750 €/month**.

DOUBLE-DEGREES AND JOINT DEGREES PROGRAMMES

TYPES OF DIPLOMAS

Double diploma:

At the end of the course, the student obtains 2 diplomas. Each university provides its own diploma.

Joint diploma:

At the end of the course, the student obtains a single diploma (French diploma) stamped by every university.

Diploma with mandatory international mobility:

The student commits to courses in which they shall carry out one or several periods of mobility. At the end of the course, they obtain the Université Lumière Lyon 2's diploma along with a transcript of grades and/or a certificate from the partner university.

NOMINATION AND APPLICATION PROCESS

Step 1: Nomination by partner university

Period to submit to the International Relations Office the nominations for future students arriving:

- Winter semester (September-January): March 31st
- Summer semester (January-July): September 30th

Step 2: Online student application

Students must complete their online application provided by the DPI team.

Step 3: Acceptance letter

Once the application form has been approved by the International Relations Office, students will then be able to download their acceptance letter directly from their MoveOn portal.

STUDENT COURSE ENROLMENT PROCEDURE

Learning agreement (contrat pédagogique)

Our University uses the OLA* system through MoveOn. For European universities that do not use this system, we can approve students' courses on a PDF version.

Tuition and fees

The CVEC* fee is subject to change (105€ for 2025-2026). Depending on the programme, some students are not subject to the CVEC. The students concerned will be notified when they register.

The payment of the CVEC is only possible through a secure platform. The link will be sent to students when they complete their application.

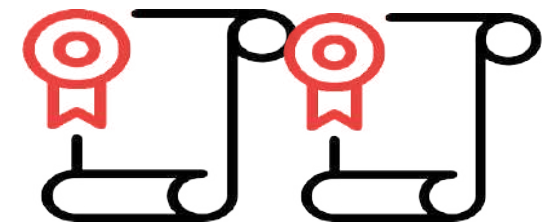

Students enrolled in some double-degree programmes are required to pay tuition fees when they register at Université Lumière Lyon 2. Students on these programmes will also be informed.

STUDENT ACCOMMODATION

Students have priority access to public student residences (CROUS). They must apply directly via the online registration form sent by our DPI team.

The number of CROUS residences available is limited. This is not the only option. We therefore recommend that students look for accommodation on the private market.

INCOMING STUDENTS PROCEDURE

NOMINATION AND APPLICATION PROCESS

Step 1: Nomination by partner university

The home university organise the selection within the applicants for the Blended Intensive Programmes (BIP). Students apply for the Erasmus+ short-term mobility grant.

The dates of the BIP are variable. Therefore, the nomination period depends on the dates of the BIP.

Step 2: Online student application

The BIP coordinator at Université Lumière Lyon 2 will send a link to our online application directly to the student by e-mail. The deadline to fill out the online form with the required information may be variable depending on the dates of the BIP. The BIP coordinator will communicate this information in due time.

Step 3: Acceptance letter

No acceptance letter for now. The Move On online form submitted for completion counts as acceptance.

STUDENT ACCOMMODATION

Travel and accommodation for the intensive week, in situ, must be organised and paid by the student according to his/her needs.

Erasmus+ scholarship will be sent to the student once the programme is finished.

We deeply recommend you to share accommodations. Every incoming student will receive an «welcome guide» to facilitate their stay.

One week stay in Lyon costs in between 300€ and 500€ (food and accommodation)

WHAT IS A STAFF MOBILITY ?

International experience isn't just for students. In fact, the University's teaching and administrative staff have the opportunity, under cooperation agreements, to spend a period of teaching or training in a partner institution. And it works both ways!

TYPES OF STAFF MOBILITY:

Teaching mobility by Erasmus+ (STA):

An opportunity for you to teach at the Université Lumière Lyon 2 for a few hours.

Observation mobility by Erasmus+ (STT):

An opportunity for you to discover a central department or component (job-shadowing). Visiting professorships are also available, either in the various UFRs and Institutes, or with the International Relations Office for the MINERVE international program.

Duration of mobility: 3-5 days



APPLICATION PROCESS

Step 1: completing the online application

Step 2: Connecting stakeholders

The Université Lumière Lyon 2 makes every effort to match the candidate with the component that best suits his/her profile. Then, depending on availability, the candidate can agree on a program to be carried out during the period of mobility.

Step 3: Signature and departure on mobility

Once the various documents have been signed by the International Relations Office, you can come and carry out your teaching or observation assignment at our university.
