Information for Erasmus students application	<p><i>Each student interested in mobilizing should proceed to registration online at the MOBILIDADEnet (https://academicos.ipvc.pt/mobilidadenet), in specific period for call for applications and follow the guidelines and procedures in the <i>MobilidadeNet_Incoming_Application_Guide_IPVC</i>. All Candidates need to read this <i>GUIDE</i> before submit the application. In this registration form is mandatory to upload, filled and scanned documents (ID Card, photo and learning agreement). Non-EU students must also submit proof of Insurance. The '<i>Learning Agreement</i>', after validation,</i></p>

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	<i>must be signed by the student and by home university and uploaded to the registration online.</i>

Any change to the same LA, should be in conformity with this agreement and requested to course and coordinators on the registration online by completing the form for '<u>Changes to Learning Agreement</u>' until 30 days after arrival at the Institution of destiny.</i>

Acceptance	<i>Student's acceptance depends on their right admission procedures and the acceptance of their Learning Agreement by course or mobility coordinators of host and home institution.</i>			
Academic year	<i>The academic year is divided into two semesters, fall and spring, each semester lasting thirteen weeks. The academic calendar varies somewhat from one faculty to another. Generally the fall semester begins in mid-September with examinations in January, while the spring semester begins in mid-February with examinations completed by the mid-June.</i>			
Expected date of arrival	<i>Approx. 2nd or 3rd week of September (depends on school) for fall semester and the 1st first or 2nd week of February for the spring semester. Exact dates will be given to the students after acceptance.</i>			
Programs offer	<i>Exchange students may take a combination of courses and subjects from different schools.</i>			
Credits	<i>IPVC uses ECTS credits. This means that 60 credits amount to one year of full-time study and 30 credits constitute one semester's full-time study. Each ECTS credit represents from 25 to 28 hours of student's work.</i>

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Language of Instruction	<i>The principal language of instruction at the IPVC is Portuguese, but most schools give some unit courses in English and tutorial as well.</i>																		
Portuguese language courses	<i>Introduction to Portuguese Language and Culture Course is organized during the first weeks of classes, normally in September and February. It is free of charge for Erasmus exchange students. Students will get a declaration in the end of the course. The cleanliness of the room as well as the change of the bed linen and towels is made by the Residence Hall's Services, every week. There is a communal kitchen - equipped with fridge, microwaves, and house wares, such as cutlery, dinnerware, glassware and dishwashing machine but only for light meals. There are no communal machines in this Residence for students to wash their clothes (only at Academic Center- Pink Residence); however, the Services of the Residence will wash, dry and iron the clothes (prices available for consulting). Due to a limited number of places, we cannot guarantee accommodation for all students.</i></p>																		

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	<p><i>Accommodation Application Procedure:</i></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Students must apply for <i>MOBILITY</i> via the <i>MOBILIDADEnet</i> platform. 2. The International Office will validate the application and request access credentials from the IT Department. 3. The International Office will send the access credentials to each student. 4. With these credentials, students can access the SAS accommodation platform at: https://sasocial.sas.ipvc.pt and proceed with their application for accommodation in the student residences. 5. Students must follow the step-by-step instructions in the attached application manual. 6. For any questions or issues, please contact the Accommodation Services by email: alojamento@sas.ipvc.pt.
<p>Student residency- and work permits for non European students</p>	<p>Students must come with visa for studies requested in the nearest Portuguese Embassy. Have 3 days after their arrival to go to the former Portuguese Immigration Service, the Agency for Integration, Migration and Asylum (AIMA) - https://aima.gov.pt/pt/estudar, which is the administrative body responsible for issuing residence permits. SEF's current administrative duties in relation to foreign citizens will now be carried out by AIMA, which concentrates on international protection, temporary protection, integration and reception, and by the Institute of Registry and Notary Affairs.</p> <p>The residence card (<i>Autorização de Residência</i>) is necessary for anyone who moves to Portugal, or for anyone who is planning to stay for longer than six months. This includes those who work, the self-employed, students, those intending to live off savings, retired people and family members of any of the above.</p> <p>First, students must request the Declaration from the International Office of IPVC, which proves their status as non-European students. They will then need to take this document to the bank to open an account and to the Financial Office (Local Tax Office) to obtain a fiscal number, before finally going to AIMA.</p>
<p>Health Issues for European Students</p>	<p>European citizens</p> <p>European students must bring the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). This is proof that they are entitled to health insurance at home. For further information or if in doubt, see the website of the State Social Security Institute, http://www.portaldasauade.pt.</p>
<p>Erasmus Guide Friends</p>	<p>The "Erasmus Guide-Friend" is a concept implemented at IPVC, in which foreigner students will be received by students from the host schools, guiding and familiarizing them into our institution, our region and our customs. The idea is that old national Erasmus students will be friends and guides for new international Erasmus students, facilitating their integration into the academic and regional environment, as well as, to their own language.</p>

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	<p><i>The role of this new 'Erasmus Guide-Friend' is to welcome students from the arrival station, take them to the international relations office, giving them enough knowledge about the schools, about their Erasmus and course coordinators, show them their residences, places to eat and shopping, and aiding them to solve the problems of daily life. Before your arrival the GMCI will send you the contact of your Erasmus Guide-friend.</i></p>
