Incoming Student Guide:	The Incoming Student Guide contains all important information for exchange students. Incoming students are therefore asked to study the Incoming Student Guide carefully.
Course Catalogue:	<p>We recommend to select each semester <u>one</u> of our modules or courses from <u>one</u> semester in the same degree programme.</p> <p>A list of the courses offered in the academic year 2021/22 can be found online. If needed, exchange students may mix lectures from different degree programmes, provided there are no time clashes. This does not apply to iLab and EPS (see below).</p> <p>Subjects offered in the 1st, 3rd and 5th semester can only be chosen in the winter semester. Subjects offered in the 2nd, 4th and 6th semester can only be chosen in the summer semester.</p> <p>Incoming students wishing to take subjects from the master degree programmes must have sufficient knowledge of the respective subjects, as all of these courses are at an advanced level.</p>
Language of instruction:	The principal language of instruction in all degree programmes is German . All incoming students attending courses taught in German need to have sufficient language skills that enable them to attend classes in German and sit examinations (minimum requirement: level B1 according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages).
Semester programmes taught in English:	<p>A number of semester programmes have been designed specifically to meet the needs of international students and are taught entirely in English. Each module comprises a minimum of 30 ECTS credits.
