Founded in 1808, The Faculty of Science offers higher education programs in the field of science and technology. These programs are based on the skills and knowledge of University of Montpellier research laboratories and evolve based on scientific and technological advances.

These courses are managed by 9 teaching departments: Biology – Life science; Biology – Ecology; Chemistry; Earth – Water – Environment (TEE); Electronics – Electrical Engineering – Automation (EEA); Physics; Computer science; Mathematics; Mechanics.

EDUCATIONAL SYSTEM

The Faculty of Science uses the ECTS credit system (European Credit Transfer System), in which 60 credits represent the workload of one year of study. The French educational system is divided into three cycles:

• First cycle (Bachelor's degree): 180 ECTS

Second cycle (Master's degree): 120 ECTS

• Third cycle (Doctoral - PhD): 180 ECTS

Which courses/options are open for exchange students?

All departments at the Faculty of Science are open for exchange students at undergraduate and graduate levels if they fulfill the course requirements.

Students wishing to register for a Master's degree can only apply either for an odd semester or for the whole year. Applying for an even semester would be complicated as it is an internship semester, which means the student has to personally look and apply for an internship during the odd semester preceding it.

Is it possible to take courses from different faculties/universities?

Yes, but in practice it is difficult due to parallel schedules. However, you can only take a minority of courses from another faculty or university.

FRENCH LANGUAGE COURSES (FLE)

Most courses are taught in French at the Faculty of Sciences.

French language courses are free of charge. They take place one evening per week, ranging from Monday to Friday depending on your group, from 6.15 pm to 8.15 pm (26h classes in all).

GRADING SYSTEM

French grading system ranges from 0 to 20. In order to receive a pass on a course, the student must have a bare minimum of 10 out of 20.
