Practical information	
Visa	<p>British and Non-European students must get a visa to study in France. In order to apply for a visa, students shall provide their current passport (valid for the duration of stay) and their acceptance letter.</p> <p>If you live in one of the 44 countries subject to the "Études en France" ("Studies in France") procedure, you must first apply to enroll in a higher education institution through the platform "Études en France". Your visa application will be automatically sent to the "Campus France office" of your home country through the platform.</p> <p>For example, the following countries are all using the "Studies in France" procedure: <i>Argentina, Chile, China, Colombia, Lebanon, Mexico, Morocco, Russia, Senegal, South Korea, Taiwan and the United-States.</i></p> <p>If you do not live in one of those countries and you need a visa to come and study in France, please contact the French consular authorities in your home country.</p> <p>Some consulates ask for an IELTS or a TOEFL proving a B2 level in English. Please also contact the French consular authorities in your home country.</p> <p>TIPS: Follow this link to see if you need a visa or not: https://france-visas.gouv.fr/web/france-visas/accueil</p> <p>If you get a (VLS-TS, visa long séjour valant de titre de séjour) You have until three months after the day of your arrival in France to validate your long-stay visa: → https://www.campusfrance.org/en/how-to-validate-your-long-stay-visa-visa-long-sejour-upon-your-arrival-in-france Please note that it will cost you 50€</p>
Mandatory insurances	<p>Three insurances are compulsory in France:</p> <p>✓ Health insurance:</p> <p>*If you are a European student, you will have to provide your European Health Insurance Card (EHIC)</p> <p>*If you are a British or a non-European student, you will have to register online at https://etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr/#/.</p> <p>Signing up via this website before going to France will allow you to apply for</p>

	<p>membership in the French social security system. The French Social Security system will reimburse you for your health care expenses. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=qEpy9Xr9UKk In addition, we highly recommend subscribing to a top-up (complementary) health insurance policy in order to ensure optimal reimbursement of healthcare expenses. This would be interesting for reimbursement with dentists, opticians, medical specialists or to cover possible hospital fees.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Housing insurance (compulsory for all students whether you live in a student residence or choose private rental housing): covers all damages that your home may suffer or that you may cause to your neighbors (fire, water damage, natural disaster, etc) ✓ Civil liability insurance (generally included with the home insurance but please double-check): covers potential damage to another person or property 										
Accommodation	<p>ISIT has partnerships with student residences, particularly ECLA residence (see https://www.ecla.com) which pre-books different types of accommodation for ISIT students. Please, find the list of ISIT partner student residences on the following link: https://www.isitinternational.com/student-life/new-student-information/ and in our practical guide (see link below). Other types of accommodation are also possible: apartment-sharing, intergenerational housing, private-flat rental... But, we highly recommend that students NEVER transfer any amount of money as long as they have not visited the accommodation or signed a lease contract, even for a pre-reservation!</p>
